#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

What first drew me to Counter Offence is that it is not a single-issue play. One might describe it as about the justice system or racial inequity, or intimate partner violence, but to reduce it to a single issue is to shrink the enormity of what Rahul's work is grappling with. These are complicated people who are making difficult decisions motivated by money, power, fear, and fury. Inside each of them are contradictions and paradoxes. Counter Offence asks us to question who defines justice, and what it looks like for different people?

As we worked I became interested in how physical theatre, choreography, and gesture could lift Rahul's text into a place of metaphor. The court addresses became opportunities for exploring each character's relationship to their perceived truth. Juxtaposing each speech with poetic movement revealed to us a world rich in emotional unspoken landscapes.

Piecing together fragmented testimony the jury is asked to make sense of the events leading up to the death of Shapoor Farhadi. Are they getting the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?

I'll let you be the judge of that.

#### PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTE

#### When a Crime against a Woman is turned into a Crime against a Race

In a multicultural country like Canada, critical social issues are shaped by one another. Struggle for equity, inclusion, and identity exist at the intersection of race, gender and class differences, which often compete. The non-monolithic nature of multiculturalism offers a framework to negotiate differences and competing truths rather than prioritize one over another.

Counter Offence addresses the struggle for justice at the intersection of race, gender and culture simultaneously. In this play, I examine the thorny question of how must a multicultural society address cultural differences that often compete and might have coercive effects. Counter Offence examines the complexities of competing struggles, i.e. violence against women and race. The play examines what happens when a white police officer arrests a racialized wife beater, especially if the battered wife is of the same race and culture as the batterer. Should the fear of racism be accepted as an excuse for a white police officer who fails to do his duty?

I thank director Murdoch Schon for leading a multicultural team of actors and designers. I thank Eric Micha Holmes for his profound, culturally sensitive upgrading of the play and my endless thanks to the Teesri Duniya Theatre staff and the Board.

I invite audiences to grapple with the idea of ending both the violence against women and racism simultaneously.


